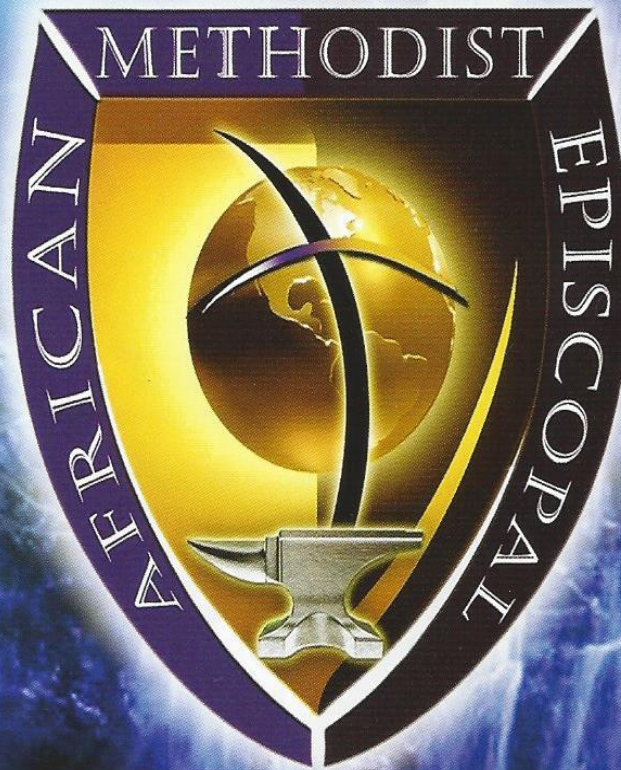

Scripture Lesson
(Please Stand for the Reading of God's Words)

Responsive: 1 Corinthians 10:1-13 (The Message) – Overcoming Temptation

Leader: Remember our history, friends, and be warned. All our ancestors were led by the providential Cloud and taken miraculously through the Sea.

People: They went through the waters, in a baptism like ours, as Moses led them from enslaving death to salvation life. They all ate and drank identical food and drink, meals provided daily by God. They drank from the Rock, God's fountain for them that stayed with them wherever they were. And the Rock was Christ.

Leader: But just experiencing God's wonder and grace didn't seem to mean much—most of them were defeated by temptation during the hard times in the desert, and God was not pleased.

People: The same thing could happen to us. We must be on guard so that we never get caught up in wanting our own way as they did. And we must not turn our religion into a circus as they did—“First the people partied, then they threw a dance.” We must not be sexually promiscuous—they paid for that, remember, with 23,000 deaths in one day!

Leader: We must never try to get Christ to serve us instead of us serving him; they tried it, and God launched an epidemic of poisonous snakes. We must be careful not to stir up discontent; discontent destroyed them.

People: These are all warning markers—danger! —in our history books, written down so that we don't repeat their mistakes. Our positions in the story are parallel—they at the beginning, we at the end—and we are just as capable of messing it up as they were.

Leader: Don't be so naive and self-confident. You're not exempt. You could fall flat on your face as easily as anyone else. Forget about self-confidence; it's useless. Cultivate God-confidence.

ALL: No test or temptation that comes your way is beyond the course of what others have had to face. All you need to remember is that God will never let you down; he'll never let you be pushed past your limit; he'll always be there to help you come through it.

Temptation by Joyce Meyer

The question is not “will I be tempted?” The question is “when you are tempted will you be ready?” Take CAN’T out of your vocabulary.

There are 5 things in overcoming temptation:

1. Think about your choices you are making and the consequences. Wisdom looks ahead.
2. You have to believe that you can resist temptation. Condemnation, guilt and shame work off of momentum. If you stop them early they lose their power, once they get rolling, they are hard to stop.
3. Think of facing temptation as normal life. If you are expecting a fight, you will always be ready.
4. Avoid areas of weakness. Don’t put yourself in situations where you can easily fall. If you struggle with managing your money, don’t go to the mall when you can’t afford to buy anything.
5. Don’t give yourself too much credit. We don’t graduate from being tempted. It’s so easy to think you’ve matured beyond stumbling and once that happens you make yourself an easy target.

L.E.N.T.: Let's Eliminate Negative Thinking

While teaching a group of students for Confirmation, the topic came up on “what to give up for Lent.” No fast food, limiting social media, and no candy were just a few of the ideas the youth discussed. As the youth continued to ponder and discuss their final choices, I asked this question, “What about Let’s Eliminate Negative Thinking (LENT)?” Clarity came after I wrote it out on the board—LENT!

For more than 10 years, I have worked in the area of youth ministry on both a part- and full-time basis and have noticed an unfortunate pattern. It is the acceptance of “I can’t.” This type of thinking, no matter the demographic or socioeconomic status, has plagued many of our churches, especially as it relates to young people. If we want to be totally honest, at times, many of us have struggled with the same negative notion of “I can’t.”

Sitting around the table with a class of 15 junior high students, the once noisy and playful classroom setting became mute. Eyes grew wide and finally, a voice grew loud and said, “Pastor Christal, at times it is just too hard to even try.”

How many times have we allowed that same sentiment to distract us from our vision and purpose as it relates to ministry? While the childhood saying “If at first you don’t succeed, try, try, again” might come to mind as a response to the student’s opposition. Instead, I answered with my life verse found in Philippians 4:13, “I can do all things through him who strengthens me.”

Divine strength is truly what we need in order to rid ourselves of the doubts that plague our ability to rise above it all. Instead of focusing on the limitations that might factiously be ahead, let’s focus on the promises of God with the “I can” mentality.

As we continue in this season of Holy Lent, I invite us to brush off the lint from our shoulders of self-doubt, anxiety, and worry, and instead embrace the notion to say and live into “Let’s Eliminate Negative Thinking.” Reclaim your vision. Recharge your purpose. Renew your mind this season.
